PRIMARY CAUSE:  Pilots of both aircraft were interfering with each other at low altitude without prior arrangement, in contravention of C.A.P. 100, Sec 1. para 28.  19. Out of contributing factors:	LIMITED BE REQUESTED TO TAKE DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST J.L. VANSTO.  HAVING IN MIND THE FACT THAT THIS INVESTIGATION FINDS HIM GUILTY NOT  ONLY OF BREAKING FLYING REGULATIONS, BUT ALSO OF GIVING PERJURED  TESTIMONY IN RESPECT TO HIS ALTITUDE. IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED THAT EVERY EFFORT BE MADE TO SECURE SUFFICIENT PILOT REPLACEMENTS SO THAT THE MANAGERS OF THE VARIOUS OPERATING COMPANIES MAY BE IN A POSITION OF ACTION TAKENITO DISCHARGE PILOTS WHO COMMIT INFRACTIONS OF FLYING REG-  (A) DISCIPLINARY (B) TECHNICAL (C) OTMERATIONS OR WHO ARE OTHERWISE UNSAT.  NIL  CONCLUSIONS OF A.I.B.  AIRCRAFT STALLED AND SPUN INTO THE GROUND, THE PILOT HAVING INSUFFICIENT ALTITUDE TO EFFECT RECOVERY. THE PILOT, AND INSTRUCTOR, WAS ENGAGING IN UNAUTHORIZED LOW FLYING AND MANOEUVRES WITH A/C  AT THE TIME OF LOSING CONTROL.
