Due to an error in judgment on the part of the pilot in that he allowed aircraft to stall when making a climbing turn with the result that aircraft flicked SECONDARY CAUSE OR CONTRIBUTING FACTORS: A/C flicked to the right after over, crashed to the ground and caught fire. Although pilot was experienced in the Service yet he was stalling and struck the ground comparatively inexperienced on type.
