RECOMMENDATIONS: Recommended that this accident be brought to notice of all pilots fling from Iceland and that it be emphasized that in bad weather, a/c CLASSIFICATION: should approach from west around Reykjanes Point from 202Flew into ground direction of the westward leg of Meeks Field radio Ren Range. REPORT OF C.O.: Obvious that A/C was flying too low and that crew thought they knew where they were ACTION TAKEN: and height of ground over which they were flying, REMARKS OF GROUP COMM.: Cannot be stated whether he deliberately flew a/c at such low altitude over high ground or whether it was faulty navigation.
