I never have bad dreams etc, my experience was quite a thrill. I especially enjoyed the parachute jump. It's funny that Don and I got shot down at the same place only about 4 years apart. only Paul + I got out. the plane was diving, we were more than lucky to get out. you might tell Mrs Wilson that Clarke is buried near Dieppe. There's all kinds of sports here and language classes. I can speak French ok from Paul. I think I'll go to German classes. they also have plays here which are very good. Foss Boulton left for home I didn't see him though. I was in Paris for my birthday, it's sure a beautiful place, saw arch of Triumph + Eifel Tower. there's a few guys from home here you talked to including a Clark from north of the river. send me no cigarettes well please don't worry about me now. Jim ok. I hope you won't move from where you are. all the best. Bob.

in this but here's what I want. Regardless
of what you are told you can send sports parcels.
send no fancy stuff, but sturdy stuff.
heavy shirt and sweater dark but not black
wint heavy cotton underwear, 1 pr size 9
slippers with a sturdy sole I can wear
under my flying boots, it would be fine if
you could get a hold of a battle dress tunic.
razor blades, soap, shaving + washing, sock
+ hankies, pr of flannel pyjamas, a scarf.
big combs. Besides all my flying clothing
the red cross gave us 2 suits underwear, 2 shirts
2 pr sock, 1 pr boots, 1 blue uniform, 1 great coat
hankies, comb 2 towels (oh yes send a towel)
1 bit bag, shaving bit, sewing bit all R.A.F. issue
so we're ok. some of my flying kit would be ok
for winter. a bunch of us on co's came to this
officers camp. we do both men jobs that take
about $\frac{3}{4}$ hour a day and get some living con-
ditions as officers so we're very fortunate. That's
how I spend most of my time with Don. Mac. De
old. he's sure looking great. tell the rest I'd like to
write to them but don't get the letters, naturally
you folks come first. hope you're all ok. Don't Worry Bob.

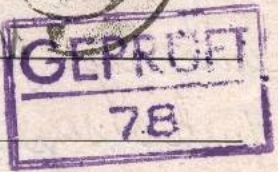
June 9/44. Dear Folks. Well you should see

isn't $\frac{1}{2}$ " long. It's lovely and warm here and we'
re all getting a good tan. There are 8 of us m.c.'s in
our room. 4 R.A.F. and 4 R.C.A.F. One of the English
boys is the Cook and is getting ok at it. we do our
own washing and as we have hours to spare
I keep my stuff pretty clean. besides our weekly
Red Cross parcel we get a good food ration from
the Germans so we eat lots. I'll write the odd letter
to some other people then you can read it after them.
we have a nice swimming pool here, and our
compound is very large, we have a dandy sport
field too. we get lots of music from the orchestra
gramophone etc. and there's always some sports
activities on. there are only a few of us Canadian
m.c.'s here but lots of officers. There's 3 of us
from Brandon here. we get a lot of good
music and news from a German loud
speaker, it's all German but a lot of guys
can understand it. Well I pray you know
I'm a P.O. woman. I hated to think of the sus-
pence you went through. I also pray that
we'll soon be united. my thoughts and
prayers are constantly with you all. love Bob.

out, after he fought to keep it steady while we jumped,
it was burning so. It was shot to pieces and we owe
our hides to him for the way he battled and kept con-
trol of it so we could jump. Cliff Wheelhouse was
buried with Clark and I know nothing of the
rest. We're having lots in the theatre now. just
saw a German film. Its getting chillier now so
they play football. I have lots of clother for the
winter. Give my best to Walter + orange. I think of
them a lot. I sincerely hope Walter is ok. I just read

DEC 13, 44, Dear Folks, just received my
Canada house parcel from London, contain-
ing a blanket, pyjamas, scarf, hat,
gloves, socks (2 PR) underwear, towel, heavy
sweater, sewing kit, a full toilet kit,
chocolate and gum, so in set for the winter
I had enough blankets before with you're 2 red
ones, so I'll give one (not a red one) to one of the
American boys in our room, who hasn't so many.
In our room we have 5 English boys, 2 are fleet air
arm and have been down since early 1940, 3 are R.A.F
prisoners from 2 to 3 years, there are 4 Canadians
including Paul and myself W.O. Hal Fundlater
from Vancouver, shot down 3 days after us, and W.O.
Wil Hamilton from Montreal a P.O.W. since 42.
plus 3 Americans shot down in July, they're swell
guys, make up our room, we play Cards and
Monopoly most of the time. Thank Aunt Mary
for her letter, I got you're letter forms with
the photos, I'll write to uncle Walter at
minette, we started to make a rink but it won't
freeze, Xmas in 2 weeks I'll think of you all that
day, should be home for the next one. Give my
best to the Connection, Gene, and the Wilsons.
I'm keeping very good, hope you are too. Love, Bob.
