127 Airfield R.A.F., R.A.F. Station, Kenley, Surrey.	1-3-44		No operations and no non-operational flying to-day. The remainder of the pilots and our N.C.O.s, P/Ls. G.S. Morris, and the squadron clerk came back fromutton Brunswick by rail to-day. The other squadrons here did a sweep to-day which proved unsatisfactory. We are all hoping the food here will improve until it reaches the high standard set by Sutton Brunswick. P/O. H.R. Finlay was reported to the squadron to-day as part of "B" Flight. P/O. T.A. Brannigan, P/O. L.G. Keltie and P/O. R.H. Middlemiss were posted to 142 Airfield R.A.F., Waco, to-day.		
	2-3-44		There was one operation carried out to-day and outside of being bounced by Thunderbolts it proved unsatisfactory. There were only six non-operational sorties carried out to-day.		
	3-3-44		One operation was carried out to-day, escorting 100 Marauders to bomb Lang/Athies. No enemy aircraft were seen. Jerry was to be conserving his fighter strength for something big. In the afternoon a fighter sweep was done by our wing which penetrated to the Lille/Central areas. No enemy aircraft were seen but some flak was experienced from Lille. To-day again there were only six non-operational sorties carried out.		
	4-3-44		There were two operations carried out to-day, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. On the morning do the bombers were recalled after reaching the French coast. No enemy aircraft were seen today. There were thirty-four non-operational sorties today.		
	5-3-44		Today there were no operations carried out nor was there any non-operational flying done. P/O. G.S. Morris was posted to the squadron to-day from 142 Airfield R.A.F. He has done a tour in Malta and all the pilots welcomed him to our squadron.		
	6-3-44		One operation to-day as close escort to the bombers. Many aircraft were reported but none were seen. There were 16 non-operational sorties done to-day for a total of (9:10) hours.		
	7-3-44		Today our pilots saw some enemy aircraft but luck was not with us as they could not be engaged. There was only one operation done to-day. We did our first bit of night flying this evening. 3 sorties for a total of 1 hour.		
	8-3-44		Two shows to-day - and also 21 non-operational sorties. We were escorting on the morning do and this afternoon carried out an eight man Roger. No enemy aircraft were seen. On the Roger we lost two pilots, P/O. J.H. Ballantyne, 100 and P/O. A.J. Dwyer our adjutant. P/O. J. Preston's aircraft was severely damaged by flak but he managed to land at Priston. P/O. Ballantyne's a/c was seen to hit the ground and explode and very little hope is held for him. He has been posted as missing believed killed. P/O. A. Goldberg reported that he was going to attempt a crash landing. He has been posted as missing but we all are hoping he will be walking back to us one of these days. P/O. L. Foster was posted to No. 51 Sqn. R.A.F. to-day.		
	9-3-44		No operations to-day but 26 sorties were carried out on practice flying in the late afternoon. We were scrubbed to Ford to patrol a practice landing of troops.		
	10-3-44		The aircraft were unable to return to base to-day the weather being very u/s. A lot of grubbing was heard but it wasn't very long before a party was organised.		
	11-3-44		The aircraft returned to-day, but their trip back home from Ford was the only flying done to-day. "B" Flight had a party this evening and according to all reports it was a howling success.

127 Airfield H.Q. RAF Station, Kenley, Surrey.	12-3-44		No operations to-day but an early morning exercise in co-operation with the army. This evening 3 sorties were carried out on night flying for a total of 3 hours flying time. P/O's Whittemore, Wall, Rhodes, W.L. Doyle, and P.M. Green were posted to 403 to-day from 3 (R.A.F.) R.C.		
	13-3-44		The aircraft were scrambled to-day and they fired their guns into the sea off Beachy Head on their return the re-arming of the aircraft was timed. When we go to the field it is not at all unlikely that all our aircraft will return with empty guns and it is a good thing to know how long it will take to reload them. An army convoy was beat-up to-day and in all there were 35 non-operational sorties.		
	14-3-44		A rather quiet day — a great panic in the morning with the pilots up by seven for briefing at 8:15. The sweep was subsequently cancelled and the pilots got their excitement from doing tendmous to-day.		
	15-3-44		One sweep was carried out to-day and we went in behind 401 Squadron who caught up with 6 P.R.U.s. P/W 190's trying to land at Cambrai. Lieutenant 401 shot four of them down. After this sweep the wing landed at Haslewood. No other sweep developed to-day and our aircraft returned to base at 1800 hours.		
	16-3-44		No operations to-day — we were released to do some training. We were escort to some Mustangs who were late at R.V. as usual. The pilots report a fairly good picture in the seas to-night.		
	17-3-44		Thick fog stopped all flying to-day. Some shoot shooting was organised by the pilots. All the pilots appear to be in good spirits and they have been busy all day polishing the cockpit covers of their aircraft.		
	18-3-44		Only non-operational flying done to-day. There were 30 sorties on this type of flying to-day. One of our best pilots was killed in a flying accident to-day. Three pilots led by P/O. R.W. Denison took off in a section P-51D when their "enamel" aerodrome P/O. Denison's engine failed. He attempted a crash landing on an asphalt dress but undershot the field crashing on a highway. P/O Denison was killed instantly and the aircraft was a complete write off.		
	19-3-44		No flying at all to-day as the weather was very bad. The wing was released in the afternoon so that it was very quiet around our dispersal this afternoon.		
	20-3-44		There was one operation carried out to-day and as usual no enemy aircraft were seen. The pilots report that the flak is very accurate. There were 11 non-operational sorties carried out for a total of 5 hours flying time.		
	21-3-44		Bad weather prevented flying to-day and the pilots spent a quiet day in the mess. Funeral arrangements have been completed for the Burial of P/O. R.V. Denison.		
	22-3-44		Just a few sorties on practice flying to-day. P/O. Denison's funeral was held to-day at Brookwood Cemetery in Surrey. Most of the pilots attended and the funeral was carried out with full Military Honours. At the conclusion of the ceremony all the pilots present led by the Commanding Officer, S/L. R.A. Buchan, R.A.F. stepped up to the grave and saluted P/O. Denison for the last time.

127 Airfield H.Q. RAF Station, Kenley, Surrey.	23-3-44		There was a sweep carried out to-day and even though our aircraft flew at 5,000 feet over Paris they were not molested by either flak or enemy aircraft. There were 10 non-operational sorties done to-day.		
	24-3-44		Non-operational flying to-day. The weather cleared in around 3 p.m. after 21 sorties had been completed. We are practicing dive bombing and army co-operation. P/O. J.A. Wilson was posted to R.G.A.F. HQ Depot, Warrington, for reparation for duty in Canada.		
	25-3-44		Dive bombing again to-day. More bad luck. P/L. Hancock backed out when pulling out of a dive after bombing rolled over on his back and crashed on the edge of the aerodrome. He was killed instantly and the aircraft was completely wrecked. We have lost four pilots this month and we are all hoping that this run of bad luck will stop soon.		
	26-3-44		More practice flying to-day. To-day there was a church service held in the Dispensary. In the morning some shoot shooting was done by the pilots who are now thinking of taking on the Pilots of 421 again in a shoot shooting contest. P/L. Hancock will be buried tomorrow at Brookwood Cemetery.		
	27-3-44		Army coop exercises today. 10 non-operational sorties were carried out by the squadron to-day. In the afternoon the pilots were at Brookwood for P/L. Hancock's funeral. The service was conducted by S/L. Anderson the reverend padre and full military honours were accorded with the last post being sounded at the conclusion of the service. P/O. R.V. Doyle and P/O. E.D. Kelly were posted to the squadron from 3 (R.A.F.) R.C. to-day for flying duties.		
	28-3-44		Thirteen sorties on army co-operation to-day. There were no operations carried out. It was foggy until noon to-day but the weather cleared enough in the afternoon to allow the army co-operation show to be carried out.		
	29-3-44		No flying at all to-day, it was foggy in the morning and remained very dull for the whole day. We were released at 2 p.m. this afternoon and the pilots were soon on their way to London.		
	30-3-44		We were again flying in co-operation with the army to-day. Our squadron has been getting plenty of practice with the army lately and the pilots are getting anxious to do some more operational flying. There were 36 non-operational sorties carried out to-day.		
	31-3-44		In the morning the cloud was 10/10ths but it cleared up later in the afternoon allowing our pilots to take part in an army beat-up exercise which was the only flying done to-day.		
		NOTE: The health of the squadron was very good this month and outside of a few pilots having slight colds there was nothing to worry about.
